

The district is grateful to the community for its investment in Orono Schools. Technology is funded through a voter-approved levy set to expire in 2021. The district is seeking renewal, and a marginal increase, to keep pace with rising costs and avoid cuts to programs, staff and services.

- Technology in Orono Schools is funded through voter-approved levy dollars, not the state. The 2020 ballot question seeks to secure technology funding for the next 10 years.
- Many systems in Orono Schools are at the end of their useful life. Up-to-date, reliable technology infrastructure will support connectivity between teachers and students during on-campus or distance learning.
- The existing technology levy is part of residents' current tax structure. Approval of the 2020 levy will result in an additional investment of \$6.25 per month on a \$400,000 home for taxes payable in 2021.
- In recent years, Orono Schools per-pupil technology spending has lagged behind neighboring districts. To keep programs and teaching and learning tools up to date, Orono Schools is asking for a marginal increase from the levy first approved in 2002 and renewed in 2011.
